I. Section 604(b)

The Water Quality Management Planning Program is an environmental management grant program awarded by EPA directly to the environmental agencies of the States and Territories. Section 604(b) of the Clean Water Act (CWA) provides for the reservation of 1% of each State's Clean Water State Revolving Fund allotment to carry out planning activities under Sections 205(j) and 303(e) of the CWA. The Guam Environmental Protection Agency (Guam EPA) proposes to utilize 604(b) funding appropriated in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) for allowable activities as described below. Proposed activities support the ARRA goal to promote economic recovery and the Section 604(b) goal to provide water quality planning and management of EPA grants under Section 205(j) - - - Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA) funded projects. The ARRA allotment for Guam EPA includes \$100,000 under the CWSRF; and \$100,000 for carrying out purposes under CWA section 319.

- A. Guam EPA proposes to collaborate with GWA in planning and management of ARRA Projects, including public noticing and approval of the GWA ARRA Priority Project List, and support GWA in meeting the requirements of the ARRA Grants guidance. ARRA projects proposed by GWA include water and energy efficiency improvements and other environmentally innovative activities. Guam EPA will conduct site inspections of GWA projects approved to receive ARRA grant funds, and review Quarterly, Monthly & Weekly reports as required to ensure appropriate application of ARRA grant funds.
- B. Guam EPA will review, revise, and update the 1996 Ugum Watershed Management Plan. This plan should provide a road map to help the Watershed Planning Committee identify the problems, set goals, and implement solutions in the Ugum Watershed. The environmental benefit of this project is the protection of the Ugum River as a drinking water source through reduced sediment to the Ugum River. A second benefit is a "cost benefit" to GWA and the public due to increase efficiency of the Ugum Water Treatment Plant. The development of a Talofofo Sub-Watershed Management Plan will not be undertaken as initially planned in the scope of work under this grant.

II. Administration

Guam EPA shall compile and submit Quarterly Reports and Monthly & Weekly Reports to EPA and participate in periodic conference calls as scheduled. All ARRA reports will be kept discrete from other reports; but they will be submitted in conjuction with the Agency's overall quarterly report as part of its submission for the consolidated grant or monthly & weekly reports as provided for in the ARRA guidance document.

- A. Quarterly Reports Guam EPA will submit reports to EPA no later than 10 days at the end of each calendar quarter that will contain 1) total amount of recovery funds received from EPA, 2) the amount of recovery funds received that were expended or obligated to projects or activities, 3) a detailed list of all projects or activities for which recovery funds were expended or obligated, and 4) detailed information on any subcontracts or subgrants awarded by Guam EPA.
- B. Monthly & Weekly Reports Guam EPA will submit monthly reports on the uses of funds provided by the ARRA. A weekly report will be submitted of 1) financial accounts containing total appropriations, total obligations, and total expenditures as recorded in agency financial systems on a cumulative basis, and 2) A short bulleted list of the major actions taken to date and any major planned actions.

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IV. Training & Meetings

Guam EPA will participate in and/or attend conference calls/training/regional meetings with EPA and/or GWA as needed. Staff travel will be related to clean water act and watershed management training. Training is an important component of quality assurance for the Guam EPA ARRA 604(b) Program.
