According to regulations (40CFR 229.1) based on the Marine Protection, Research and Sanctuary Act of 1972, human remains transported from U.S. ports or on U.S. vessels may be buried at sea under specified conditions.

Human remains which are cremated or not cremated shall take place no closer than 3 nautical miles from land and in the water no less than six hundred (600) feet deep for not cremated. Human remains shall be prepared for burial at sea and shall be buried in accordance with accepted practices and requirements as may be deemed appropriate and desirable.
