According to regulations (40CFR 229.1) based on the Marine Protection, Research and Sanctuary Act of 1972, human remains transported from U.S. ports or on U.S. vessels may be buried at sea under specified conditions.

Human remains which are cremated shall take place no closer than **3 nautical miles from land**.

Non-cremated remains: The MPRSA general permit authorizes burial at sea of **non-cremated human remains** at locations **at least 3 nautical miles from land** and in ocean waters **at least 600 feet deep**.

Human remains shall be prepared for burial at sea and shall be buried in accordance with accepted practices and requirements as may be deemed appropriate and desirable.
